1.2 Introducing the TV

You can watch SECAM/ PAL/ DVB-T broadcast, cable, or digital television channels, and easily connect a VCR, STB or DVD player to the SCART, HDTV (Component), AV (Composite), and HDMI input ports (location of these ports depends on model). You can also use the TV as a monitor for your PC by connecting it through the VGA port.






1 Open the battery compartment cover at the back of the remote control (A).


Setting up your TV

2.1 Power Connection

- 1 Connect the power cord to the AC IN input jack on the rear of the TV.
- 2 Insert the plug at the other end of the power cord into a power outlet.

2.3 Using the TV

2.3.1 Turning the TV On and Off

- 1 Press on the control panel or remote control. The power LED indicator on the TV changes from red to green, indicating that the TV is on.
- 2 Press again. The power LED changes from green to red, indicating that the TV is off.

2.3.2 Switching Source Signals

Press **INPUT** on the control panel or remote control to select the incoming source signal.

2.3.3 Performing an Automatic Channel Search

Before using the TV to view programs, you need to activate the channel search first.

- 1 Press MENU on the control panel or remote control, then select to enter the Channel / DTV menu.
- 2 Select Auto Search.
- 3 Press > on the remote control to run the channel search.

2.3.4 Selecting Channels

- Press P
 on the remote control or control panel to increase the channel number
- Press P▼ on the remote control or control panel to decrease the channel number.
- Enter the specific channel number by pressing the number buttons on the remote control.


2.3.5 Adjusting the Volume

- 1 Press VOL+ on the control panel or remote control to increase the volume.
- 2 Press VOL- on the control panel or remote control to decrease the volume.
- 3 Press MUTE to eliminate sounds, and press MUTE again or press the volume buttons to restore the original volume.

Adjusting On-Screen Display (OSD) Settings

The On-Screen Display (OSD) menu system provides a quick and simple method to adjust the TV settings. The OSD menu can be accessed conveniently through the buttons on the remote control.

Before going into details of each OSD option, you may get acquainted with the placement of the OSD system:.

3.1 OSD Setting Menus

Follow the instructions indicated on the down side of the OSD Function Menu. Press P▲/P▼on the control panel or ✓/ ✓ arrow keys to scroll through the menus, **VOL** + on the control panel or the ✓ arrow key to select an item, or **MENU** to exit the OSD menu.

The following menus can be set by different adjustment methods.

3.2 Adjusting Picture Settings

- Press MENU to enter the OSD Main Menu screen. The Picture menu is then displayed.
- 2 Press > to enter the Picture menu.
- 3 Press \(\times \) to select an item.
- 4 Press / > to adjust the scales or options settings.



- 5 Press MENU to return to the Picture menu entry.
- 6 Press MENU to exit the OSD menu.
 - The Picture menu can be used to adjust the Smart Picture, Brightness, Contrast, Colour, Tint, Sharpness, Colour Temperature, Advanced Control, and Advanced Video (PC only) settings.
 - The Smart Picture can be set to Standard, Vivid, Movie, Eco, or Personal.
 - The Brightness, Contrast, and Colour can be adjusted by pressing
 to move the scales from 0 to 100.
 - The **Tint** can be adjusted by pressing < />
 /> to move the scales from -32 to 32.
 - The Sharpness can be adjusted by pressing \(/ \) to move the scales from 0 to 7.
 - The Colour Temperature can be set to Standard, Warm, or Cool.
 - The Advanced Control can be used to adjust the Noise Reduction, Flesh Tone, Backlight, and X-Contrast.
 - The Noise Reduction can be set to Auto, Off, Low, Medium, or High.
 - . The Flesh Tone can be set to On or Off.
 - The Backlight can be adjusted by pressing \(/ > \) to adjust the scales from 0 to 100.
 - The X-Contrast can be set to On or Off.

• The Advanced Video can be used to adjust the Auto Config, Horizontal, Vertical, Phase, Clock, and Resolution settings for PC mode.

3.3 Adjusting Sound Settings

- 2 Press v to select the Sound menu.
- 3 Press > to enter the Sound menu.

- 6 Press MENU to return to the Sound menu entry.
- 7 Press MENU to exit the OSD menu.

 - The Sound Mode can be set to Music, Speech, or Personal.
 - The Equalizer 120Hz, Equalizer 500Hz, Equalizer 1.5KHz, Equalizer 5KHz, and Equalizer 10KHz can be adjusted by pressing
 /> to move the scales from -6 to 6.
 - The Balance can be adjusted by pressing \(/ > \) to move the scales from -50 to 50.
 - · The Virtual Surround can be set to On or Off.
 - The Digital Audio Out can be set to Dolby Digital, PCM, or Off.

- The SPDIF Delay can be adjusted by pressing \(/ \) to move the scales from 0 to 250.
- The AVL can be set to On or Off.
- The Type can be set to Normal, Hard of Hearing, or Audio Description.
- To adjust the Audio Description, select Audio Description in the Type setting first. Press (/) to adjust the scales from 0 to 100.

Note: The options available on the OSD may vary depending on the input signal source.

 - The TV menu can be used to adjust the Country, Audio Carrier, and Channels settings.
 - The Country can be set to Austria, Belgium, Bulgaria, Croatia, Czech Republic, Denmark, Finland, France, Germany, Greece, Hungary, Iceland, Ireland, Italy, Luxembourg, Netherlands, Norway, Poland, Portugal, Romania, Russia, Serbia, Slovakia, Slovenia, Spain, Sweden, Switzerland, Turkey, and UK.
 - The Audio Carrier can be set to Dual I, Dual II, Mono, and Stereo.
 - The Channels can be used to perform or adjust the Channel Scan, Update Scan, Single RF Scan, Analog Manual Scan, Channel Skip, Channel Sort, Channel Edit, Decoder, and Analog Ch Fine Tune settings.



• Select Channel Scan to activate the automatic TV channel search.





- Select **Update Scan** to automatically add channels to the existing channel list.
- Select Single RF Scan to search for digital channels within the selected RF (Radio Frequency) channel.



• Select **Analog Manual Scan** to search for analog channels within the specified frequency range.



 Use Channel Skip to prevent the desired channels from being accessed by pressing P▲/P▼ on the remote control or control panel.



- Select the Channel Sort to change the order of the channel list.
- The Channel Edit allows you to adjust the detailed items, including Channel Number, Channel Name, Frequency, Colour System, and Sound System for each channel.





- To change the channel number, select Channel Number and use the number keys on the remote control to type numbers.
- To change the channel name, select Channel Name and use the number keys on the remote control to type letters, digits, or symbols. Press keys repeatedly to toggle different characters.

- To change the channel frequency, select **Frequency** and use the number keys on the remote control to type the desired frequency.
- The Colour System can be set to Auto, DAL, or SECAM.
- The Sound System can be set to I, D/K, A2 D/K, A2 D/K1, B/G, A2 B/G, L, or $L^\prime.$
- The **Decoder** supports the Canal+ (paid TV channel with encrypted programs).
- Select **Analog Ch Fine Tune** to adjust precisely the analog channel frequency to ensure high signal quality.

Note: The TV Settings are only available in TV mode.

3.5 Adjusting Features Settings

- Press MENU to enter the OSD Main Menu screen.
- 2 Press v to select the Features menu.
- 3 Press > to enter the Features menu.




- Disconnect all the cables and cords from the TV to prevent breakage.
